Minutes and Progress Report

The committee considered the minutes of the meeting held on 18 October 2013 together with the progress report.

Resolved on the proposal as Councillor Purcell and seconded by Councillor Larkin that the minutes be confirmed and taken as read. The progress report was noted.

CE 02/1311

Matters arising from the Minutes and Progress Report

Traffic Wardens assisting with safety at identified schools

The members noted that the roads safety officer would prepare a suitable information note / letter for distribution.

Noise Reduction M4

The members requested that they be updated when a response was received from the NRA on this matter.

Traffic survey Newtown/ Arclough Road

The members noted that the roads design team would arrange a meeting.

Illegal parking outside NUI, Maynooth, Manor Mills shopping centre

The members noted that the traffic wardens have been asked to patrol this area.

Disabled parking bay, Maynooth

The members welcomed and noted that the area office has reviewed the location in detail.

Pay parking bye-laws Maynooth

The pay parking bye-laws were deferred to a special meeting to be held 22 November 2013.

To install speed cushions along Celbridge Road

The members noted that the report would be circulated to the members as soon as it was available.

Repair damaged fencing on the Hazelhatch Road

The members noted the issue has been listed for attention by the area office, however it was not considered a high priority.

Repairs to footpath Avondale, Leixlip

The members welcomed the news that the work was now completed.

Traffic Calming measures at the vicinity of Confey Graveyard, Leixlip

The members noted that the traffic calming measures planned for the vicinity of Confey Graveyard, Leixlip.

To provide public light between Saint Patrick's Park and Dara Court

The report stated that the public lighting column has been relocated.

Pedestrian crossing at St Mary's Boys National School, Maynooth and Update on progress of traffic calming at Glen Eason/Easton Meadows, Leixlip

Mr Johnathan Deane verbally gave the members a detailed report on both issues, he stated that the ramp at St. Mary's Boys National School could be designed into a zebra crossing. It was not possible to design a zebra crossing at Glen Eason/Easton Meadows, Leixlip a full signal crossing would need to be put in place. As there was no funding available the area office could give no commitment to the project.

Remove or replace the Sli-na-Slainte sign in Celbridge

The members noted that a letter has been issued to the Heart Foundation as requested. Councillor O'Rourke stated that there were two signs facing the wrong direction one was at the junction of the famine graveyard and Shackleton road and the other sign was at the Maynooth road/Ballygoran road junction beside Crodaun.

Removal of signs near Hazelhatch Railway Station

The members noted that a letter has been written to Iarnród Éireann in line with the request.

Naming portion of street from the bridge to the college entrance

The members noted that this was a matter for the members and was on the agenda for the November meeting.

Deputation- from Pikesbridge Road, Maynooth Residents Association.

The members requested that the traffic survey report be available at the next committee meeting.

Removal of illegal signs/posters, Celbridge

The members noted that the council has written to the owners (where known) informing them (1) that the signs are restricted under the litter laws and (2) that any further placement would result in litter fines

William Rowantree House Leixlip

The members noted that the owner would be contacted to ascertain plans for the building.

Berm at Oldtown Road, Celbridge

The members noted the report.

Autumn pruning programme

The members noted the report for autumn pruning for Celbridge, Maynooth and Leixlip which have either been completed, are in progress or are due to be completed before the end of the year.

Communications mast River Forest Hotel

The members were informed that to date no reply has been received from Mr Phil Hogan Minister for Environment, Community and Local Government in relation to this matter.

Integrated Services Programme in Celbridge

To receive an update on the Integrated Services Programme in Celbridge.

Ms Honor Griffin and Ms Susan Buckley attended the meeting and updated the members on the current status of Integrated Services Programme in Celbridge. They explained the five steps on the structure of the programme and the research that has progressed to date. An Cathaoirleach and the members thanked both Ms Griffin and Ms Buckley for attending the meeting and thanked them for their presentation.

Planning and Development Acts 2000 – 2012

Planning and Development Regulations 2001 – 2012 – Part VIII

To consider report regarding the temporary R148 Road Realignment, Maynooth Road, Leixlip. As the report was not finalised Ms Kavanagh requested that this matter be deferred to a special meeting, date and time to be agreed by the members. The members all agreed to defer the item to a special meeting.

Resolved: That a special meeting be arranged to consider the report regarding the temporary R148 Road Realignment, Maynooth Road,

CE 05/1311

The proposed extinguishment of public rights of way

To consider the proposed extinguishment of public rights of way over a section of the R148 Leixlip-Maynooth Regional Road between the junction of the L1014 Kellystown Lane and the roundabout at the junction of the R449 and the R148. Ms Kavanagh stated that the Managers report would be available in the coming week and requested that this item be deferred to a special meeting to be arranged by the members. The members all agreed to defer the item to a special meeting.

Resolved: That a special meeting be arranged to consider the proposed extinguishment of public rights of way over a section of the R148 Leixlip-Maynooth Regional Road between the junction of the L1014 Kellystown Lane and the roundabout at the junction of the R449 and the R148.

CE 06/1311

Left green filter light be installed at the Glenroyal exit to the Straffan Road

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor McGinley :

That a left green filter light be installed at the Glenroyal exit to the Straffan Road to act at the same time as the right green filter inwards, in order to reduce the tailback of cars trying to exit from the hotel/shopping centre

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that due to geometric constraints at the junction (i.e. the angle for traffic exiting from the Glenroyal Hotel/Shopping Centre Site), it was not possible to guarantee that traffic exiting left from Glenroyal can complete the turn in a safe manner. Furthermore, there was little scope to disaggregate both left and right turning traffic from the Glenroyal so the possible benefits are limited. Councillor McGinley disagreed with the report and stated that there was no reason why the left green filter light can not act at the same time as the right green filter light. Councillor McGinley requested to meet the traffic management team on site to discuss.

Resolved: That the traffic management team arrange to meet Councillor McGinley on site.

CE 07/1310

To discuss free parking in Celbridge and Leixlip

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

That the area committee agree on the days of free parking in Celbridge and Leixlip over Christmas to assist businesses and to encourage people into the towns.

The members also considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Larkin :

That pay parking for the festive season be relaxed in Celbridge and Leixlip from 16 December 2013 to 2 January 2014, to encourage trade in the towns.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the days that have been suggested are Monday, 16 December 2013 to Friday, 2 January 2014. This would mean that the towns of Celbridge, Leixlip and Kildare would be consistent. A long discussion took place in relation to the matter of free parking. Councillors O'Rourke, Larkin, T Byrne, K Byrne and C Purcell welcomed the news and saw it as positive and encouragement for the trade of both towns. The members requested that the traders do not park in public areas. It was proposed by Councillor O'Rourke and second by Councillor Larkin. Councillor Griffin and Councillor McGinley both opposed the proposal of free parking.

Resolved: On the proposal of Councillor O'Rourke, seconded by Councillor Larkin that free parking in Celbridge and Leixlip would be implemented from 16 December 2013 to Friday 3 January 2014.

CE 08/1311

50Km/h speed limit at Castletown estate

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

That the council confirm if the 50 km/h speed limit is correct at the exit of Castletown estate onto Celbridge Main Street or should it be 30 km/h in the interest of safety to all road users and if a yield sign can be installed inside the gates to assist traffic exiting.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November confirming that the current sign arrangement was correct in that there was a special 30kmh speed limit within Castletown housing estate which ends at the Castletown gates when the default urban speed limit of 50 kmh takes over.

The report was noted.

Dublin registered taxis

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Purcell:

That we contact appropriate authorities to lodge a complaint about Dublin registered taxis encroaching into County Kildare in search of business.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that if the committee wishes Ms Kavanagh would write to the Taxi Regulator (NTA) on their behalf. The members supported Councillor Purcell on the motion and all were in agreement that a strong letter issue to the Taxi Regulator (NTA) on behalf of the Celbridge area committee.

Resolved: That the roads and transport department issue a letter to the Taxi Regulator (NTA) on behalf of the Celbridge area committee in relation to Dublin registered taxis encroaching into County Kildare in search of business.

Anti-skid surfacing on the Barberstown to Celbridge Road

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

That it is resolved to provide anti-skid surfacing on the Barberstown to Celbridge Road in the area where there is a series of bad bends (these can be clearly identified where there are repeated gaps in the roadside hedge).

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 confirming that this section of road was listed for attention under the low cost safety improvement scheme for 2014. Pending grant approval it was hoped to carry out the work in April 2014.

The report was noted.

Double yellow lines at Scoil Na Mainistreach

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

That double yellow lines be put in place across the road and in front of Scoil Na Mainistreach to prevent parking at gateways of residents who are regularly blocked in at school times and that this be a temporary measure until the proposed set down inlets on the Shackleton Road are put in place.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that the area office was currently consulting with Scoil na Mainistreach about works that are intended to commence on the 25 November to hopefully improve access to the school. The request for these double yellow lines could be considered at the same time.

The report was noted.

Footpath at Saint patricks Park, Celbridge

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

That the footpath at the side of house number (details supplied), Saint Patricks Park, Celbridge be repaired urgently where it has been damaged by heavy goods vehicles.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November stating that the overseer would be asked to inspect this location.

The report was noted.

Safer passage over Pikes Bridge

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Griffin:

Following on from the presentation by Old Railpark residents, we call on the roads section to design a safer passage over Pikes Bridge, especially for those who have to push buggies over this totally unsafe bridge.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that the as indicated in the progress report, vehicle monitoring was currently ongoing on the Pikes Bridge road. The area office would revert to the next meeting with the results of

the survey. The members requested the report at the next meeting of the Celbridge area meeting.

Resolved: That the area office issue a report on vehicle monitoring on Pikes Bridge road at the next meeting of the Celbridge area committee.

CE14/1311

Widening of footpath from Brady's to the taxi office

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Griffin :

That the council examine how best to widen the footpath at the square from Brady's to the taxi office, so that pedestrians can use this access safely.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that widening of the footpath at this location would remove parking along this short section of roadway. The area office would suggest a meeting on site with Councillor Griffin and any of the affected businesses to agree on a way forward. Councillor Griffin requested a meeting on site with the area engineer.

Resolved: Councillor Griffin requested that a meeting be arranged on site with the area engineer.

CE 15/1311

Naming of road opposite the Castle in Maynooth

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Griffin:

That the following suggestions be considered for the naming of the road opposite the castle in Maynooth;

- Geraldine Avenue/Drive/Way
- Castle Avenue/Way
- College Avenue/Drive

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 stating that it was a matter for the members to decide. The members discussed the issue on naming the road opposite the castle in Maynooth and no agreement was reached. They suggested to write to St.Patricks College and asked them for their suggestions and reviews on the naming.

Resolved: That a letter issue to St Patricks College, Maynooth asking them for their suggestions and reviews on naming the road opposite the castle in Maynooth.

Bus stop outside Carton House

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Larkin:

That we ask Dublin Bus and the council to review the locations of the Dublin bound bus stop outside Carton House to improve safety for users.

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November 2013 confirming that the location of this bus stop can be reviewed. Perhaps the councillor could indicate to the area office his specific safety concerns. Councillor Larkin stated that there was no footpath, the bus stop was beyond the last light and in complete darkness. The members suggested amendment to the footpath and new light at the bus stop would solve the issue.

Resolved: That the area office review the safety concerns and take into consideration the following suggestion from the members: amendment to the footpath and new light at the bus stop.

CE 17/1311

Pruning of trees Celbridge Road

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Larkin :

That pruning/topping of trees be done immediately along Celbridge Road from the entrance to the Wonderful Barn to the flyover on both sides, to allow light standards function to their potential.

A report was received from the parks department dated 13 November 2013 advising that this work would be carried out as part of the pruning programme.

The report was noted.

Easton Road safe crossing measures

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor T Byrne:

Can I receive an update on the Easton Road safe crossing measures from Beech Park to Castletown estate, Leixlip?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area engineer would give a verbal report to the meeting regarding this issue. The area engineer spoke to the members in detail.

The report was noted.

Programme for blocked drains in estates

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor T Byrne:

In view of the heavy rainfall recently causing flooding in areas where drains are blocked and need clearing in all estates and roads, has a programme been put in place for this work?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that with the onset of autumn the area office has been working on the removal of leaves and clearance of gullies and would continue to do this in Leixlip until the 22 November. Councillor T Byrne requested that the area office takes into consideration the Hazelhatch road on the right hand side all the way down to Hazelhatch Park out to the train station.

Resolved: That the area office includes the Hazelhatch road on the right hand side all the way down to Hazelhatch Park out to the train station.

Hedge cutting in Ardclough

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

Can the council cut back the hedges before the advance warning school signs and speed limit signs in Ardclough?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area office intends to have a hedge cutter in for 2 to 3 days in late November to pick up various hedgerow issues throughout the area. If the members have any other isolated locations the area office would endeavour to list and address them. The report was noted.

Repair timber bollards Celbridge

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

Can the council replace/repair the timber bollards as required on the slip road from Celbridge to Junction 6 on the M4?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area office would list this for attention when time and resources allow.

The report was noted.

Remedial works on roads and footpaths in Leixlip Park

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Purcell:

Will the council give a report on the roads and footpaths in Leixlip Park indicating the worst sections and outlining remedial works that could be undertaken?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November stating that the area office has identified what was considered to be the worst areas of paths in Leixlip and are currently excavating and relaying them.

The report was noted.

Pruning of briars and bushes GAA grounds, Celbridge to railway station

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

Can the briars and bushes protruding onto the footpath from the GAA grounds, Celbridge to the railway station be cut back, as this pedestrian route is used extensively by commuters and walkers?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area office intends to have a hedge cutter in for 2 to 3 days in late November to pick up various hedgerow issues throughout the area. If the members have any other isolated locations the area office would endeavour to list and address them. The report was noted.

Yield sign and road markings at the junction in Saint Patricks Park, Celbridge

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

Can a yield sign and road markings be provided at the junction in Saint Patricks Park, Celbridge outside house (details supplied), as this is a very busy location?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area office suggests a meeting on site to discuss this request. Councillor K Byrne requested a meeting on site with the area engineer.

Resolved: Councillor K Byrne requested that a meeting be arranged on site with the area engineer.

Directional sign be erected off the Ardclough Road

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor K Byrne:

Can a directional sign be erected at the right turning off the Ardclough Road, indicating a route to Dublin and thereby reducing pressure on the dangerous Liffey Bridge?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that this request would be addressed in the coming weeks.

The report was noted.

CE 26/1311

Widening of the Liffey Bridge at Celbridge

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Griffin :

Recently we were advised that a sum of €40,000 was granted in order to draw up proposals to widen the Liffey Bridge at Celbridge, what is the status of this project and when can this committee be provided with a viewing of the drawings?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the roads and transport department ran a competition to appoint consultants for the project; however, no suitable submission was made. A revised competition was put in place and submissions are being reviewed at present. Councillor Griffin stated that a solution needs to be resolved as the bridge was overhanging towards the footpath.

Resolved: That the area office advise Councillor Griffin when submissions are reviewed.

CE 27/1311

Sign at River Liffey be replaced

The members considered the following motion in the name of Councillor Larkin :

Can the missing sign that indicates the River Liffey, located at Newbridge at the bottom of the lane, leading to Castletown, be replaced?

A report was received from the roads and transport department dated 17 November informing the members that the area office was unaware that this sign was missing and would take steps to replace it.

The report was noted.

CE 28/1311

Swimming pool for North Kildare

The members considered the following question in the name of Councilor T Byrne:

That the council apply to the Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, Leo Varadkar and his department for a grant to help fund a swimming pool in the North Kildare Amenities Complex, Leixlip. There has been an allocation of approximately €19 million extra to the sports department. As no application has been received for this project, I now ask for it to be done as a matter of urgency.

A report was received from the parks department dated 13 November stating that details of the level of funding and types of funding that can be sought under the proposed Capital Sports Grants scheme have yet to be announced. Therefore any application for funding for a swimming pool is premature. The members had a long discussion on the swimming pool in

North Kildare. The members raised their concerns and requested that an application of interest should be made to the department for a grant. Mr Minnock confirmed to the members that the councils interest has been registered. Mr Minnock noted the members comments and interests.

The report was noted.

CE 29/1311

Tree pruning in Riverdale, Leixlip

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

Can the council carry out tree pruning in Riverdale, Leixlip during the 2013\2014 schedule as per the list supplied?

A report was received from the parks department dated 13 November stating that work would be carried out on the trees in question before the end of the year in addition to other works requested by residents during the year.

The report was noted.

CE 30/1311

Civic amenity site for North Kildare

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Purcell:

That the committee be appraised on the councils plans for a civic amenity site for North Kildare.

A report was received from the environment department dated 13 November stating that the proposed recycling centre at Celbridge continues to be explored .The site would be subject to a new part viii procedure when final layout details are agreed. The DOECLG have recently confirmed that capital funding would be made available for the project. The facility would be included, subject to contract, in the bundle of recycling centres operated by contract on behalf of the council. Councillor Purcel requested clarity on where exactly the site would be for a civic amenity for North Kildare.

Resolved: That the environment department clarifies on where they plan for the site for the civic amenity for North Kildare.

CE 31/1311

Residents of Mill Lane

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Purcell :

That the committee receive a report on recent meetings with officials from the council and the residents of Mill Lane on such issues as pedestrian safety and the structural condition of the wall abutting residents gardens in Black Avenue together with other salient matters and concerns.

A report was received from director of services dated 17 November stating that he met the local residents on site. The council was aware of the desirability of the local community to effect medium/longer term improvements, particularly to pedestrian safety. Given that the council has signed a contract for the Leixlip Wastewater Treatment Plant, it was vital that works relating to the upgrade of the wastewater treatment plant proceed in accordance with the contract. It was not really feasible to carry out significant improvement works to the Avenue while the contract was ongoing. The contractor would, however, ensure that the traffic management plan continues to operate and this would be monitored on an ongoing basis. The contractor was reviewing the plan with a view to discouraging pedestrians from using the Avenue while works are ongoing and to providing signage to this effect, essentially directing them to an alternative route. That the water services capitals section has, in conjunction with Leixlip Town Council, agreed to fund the upgrade of the Silkeachain Lane. In turn, this should greatly assist in terms of providing a good standard alternative route to the park and, again, pedestrians would be encouraged to use this route while works are ongoing. The report confirmed that the Council was more than anxious to continue to engage with the local community around improvements to the Avenue and, where feasible, to agree an approach.

The report was noted.

Fines issued by the dog wardens

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor O'Rourke:

That the council give a report on the number of fines issued by the dog wardens on behalf of the council in the Celbridge Local Electoral Area since January 2013, what percentage of these fines are paid and what action is being taken on the outstanding fines.

A report was received from the environment department dated 17 November informing the members that a reply on this matter would issue at the December meeting. The members requested a report at the December committee meeting.

Resolved: That a report issue to the members at the December committee meeting.

Sewer line in River Forest estate

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor T Byrne :

Can the engineer have a look at the sewer line in River Forest estate along the pedestrian walkway to Confey College on the left hand side, down near the bungalows, as sewerage has been flowing from the mains in that area?

A report was received from the water services department dated 13 November stating that an investigation was carried out by the water services department on 8/11/2013 into this matter. No wastewater was visible at the location described. More information was requested so that water services can arrange to clarify the specific spillage site. Councillor T Byrne stated that the area in question was between house numbers 18 to 80 River Forest estate along the pedestrian walkway down near the bungalows.

Resolved: That the water services department revisited River Forest estate along the pedestrian walkway down near the bungalows between house numbers 18 to 80 to investigate the sewer line.

Low water pressure St Mary's Park, Leixlip

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Purcell:
Will the council explain the reason for low water pressure in house numbers (details supplied), St Mary's Park, Leixlip?

A report was received from the water services department dated 13 November stating that the water pressure at the public watermain was 15m (1.5 bar) and this was considered adequate pressure to serve domestic water supply needs.

The report was noted.

Sewer blockages at St Mary's Park, Leixlip

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Purcell:
Can we have the report due for the June meeting regarding sewer blockages at houses (details supplied),?

A report was received from the water services department dated 13 November confirming that a contractor has been appointed to effect relining repairs for the foul sewer in the coming weeks. This should resolve any blockage problems for the respective residents.

The report was noted.

Castlewarden/Ballygoran water provision project

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Griffin:
Can we have an update on the Castlewarden/Ballygoran water provision project? Are the council completely satisfied with all aspects of the programme?

A report was received from the water services department dated 13 November confirming that Councillor Griffin would meet the water services capital projects office and Nicolas O'Dwyer Consulting Engineers onsite on Thursday the 14 November 2013 at 14:00 to

discuss the project and any concerns identified would be addressed by the capital projects office.

The report was noted.

Unauthorised developments

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor Larkin:

How many unauthorised developments are there in our area and are there any proceedings pending?

A report was received from the planning department dated 7 November stating that the

There are approximately 350 complaints being pursued in the

Leixlip/Celbridge/Maynooth/Straffan area. Some of these may be dismissed or would proceed to Warning Letter and/or Enforcement Notice and ultimately may result in legal proceedings. At present 13 of these was the subject of legal proceedings.

The report was noted.

Install a light over ATM machine in Maynooth

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor McGinley:

That Allied Irish Bank, Maynooth, be asked to install a light over their ATM machine at their premises on Main Street, similar to the light at their banklink at the Glenroyal Hotel, in the interests of public safety.

A report was received from corporate services department dated 17 November stating that if the members wish a letter can be sent to Allied Irish Bank, Maynooth. Councillor McGinley stated that it was in the public interest that a letter issue to Allied Irish Bank, Maynooth.
