Never doing work experience again. Its getting harder and harder to get suitable work out there and the government are not doing enough for the long term unemployed.





Recipe for rhubarb & ginger jam

Ingredients

- 750g (1½lb) rhubarb, trimmed and cut into 2½cm (1in) lengths
- 625g (1¼lb) granulated sugar
- 2 lemons, squeezed
- 1½tbsp finely chopped root ginger

Method

Combine all the ingredients in a non-metallic bowl. Cover, then set aside to allow the flavours to mingle for 3 hours (at room temperature), or chill overnight.

Put the mixture in a large saucepan. bring to the boil, then leave to simmer for 7-10 minutes. To check if the jam is ready, spread a teaspoon of the mixture on a chilled plate and allow to cool slightly; the surface of the jam is at setting point if it wrinkles when pushed with your finger.

Divide the jam between three sterilised jars and seal while the mixture is still piping hot.

Tip Rhubarb and **ginger** make a great pairing but you could substitute the ginger for finely grated **orange** zest, a split vanilla pod or just make a simple plain rhubarb jam, if you like.


Clubhouse is a member run and centred service, where every individual has something valuable to contribute to the clubhouse and to society at large, irrespective of their diagnosis or level of function.
