Tips for Wrapping your Christmas Presents



- 1. Measure the wrapping paper, before cutting it:** Sit the Christmas present on the wrapping paper, you've rolled out. Pull the wrapping around the present and then cut the paper.
- 2. Use a pop-up tape strip dispenser:** You will be able to hold the paper in place with one hand, while taping with the other.
- 3. Be sure to use sharp scissors:** If you aren't using sharp enough scissors, you will not get a clean edge when you cut your wrapping paper.
- 4. Place the gift upside down when wrapping it:** This will ensure that when the gift recipient opens their gift, it will be right side up.
- 5. Use sticky to and from labels:** These will easily stay on your wrapping paper and you won't have to fuss with all that tape.
- 6. Use ribbon instead of bows:** Bows are bad for falling off your packages, so this Christmas use ribbon instead.
- 7. If you do use bows, tape them on:** For added security, tape bows into place. I know that they have a sticky back, but trust me; they never stay on!
- 8. Use gift bags:** Simply toss the Christmas present in the bag, add some tissue paper, and you're done. This is also a great option for those items that are oddly shaped.
- 9. Use a stocking for the gifts.** Simply stuff all the small gifts into the stocking and put tissue paper on top so no one can see inside.
- 10. Be creative:** with your wrapping of gifts as it will add that lovely personal touch.


Clubhouse is a member run and centred service, where every individual has something valuable to contribute to the clubhouse and to society at large, irrespective of their diagnosis or level of function.
