The Council suggested that Miss Sammon produce a recommendation from some firm or reliable person who is aware of her circumstances for the consideration of the Minister.

I have the honour to report that at the Quarterly Meeting, recently held, Contractors' Applications amounted to £526 12s. 6d. The manner in which this sum was dealt with is shown in the following table:—

During the Quarter ended 30th June, 1938, in addition to £491 17s. 0d. recommended for payment as above, the sum of £14,190 16s. 2d. was certified to the Finance Committee as follows:—Main Roads, £6,363 12s. 11d.; County Roads, £3,958 14s. 2d.; Grants and Loans, £3,968 9s. 1d.

As can be inferred from the above, contractors have reasonably well maintained their roads during the Quarter. I have prepared and submitted a Scheme for the expenditure of coming Employment Grant, according to the regulations of the Local Government Department.

All our steamrollers have been kept working during the Quarter. Our Fordson tractor, purchased in 1927, requires to be replaced by a new one, and I submit herewith a Tender from the official contractors to the Local Government Department for your consideration.

The proposed widening of the road at the Old Military Depot at Naas has never yet received the consent of the Government Authorities concerned, but many other useful widenings continue to be executed by permission of private property owners, for which they are to be thanked.

An objection has been sent to me to turf-cutting close to the road between Staplestown and Prosperous, owing to the alleged danger to vehicles or livestock which might leave the unfenced roadway, and I have thought it best to refer the matter to the County Solicitor for advice, and to take the Council's decision at their meeting.

I have, on the 21st inst., received sanction from Department of Local Government to the loan for improvement to Ponsonby Canal Bridge and Watery Lane, Straffan.

The Board of Public Works have suggested a larger amount for the upkeep of the Greice Drainage District, and about £200 would be required for the current year to comply with their requirements.

GREESE DRAINAGE.

The following letter was read from Office of Public Works :—
C85. 169/136.

6adh Iul, 1938.

We have to inform you that pursuant to section 26 of the Arterial Drainage Act, 1925, one of our Engineers inspected the above-named District in May last. His report goes to show that the attention hitherto given to maintenance is not sufficient to keep the District in as efficient condition as that which obtained when our works were completed.

Practically the entire length of the main river requires to be cleared of weed-growth, so as to keep the channel open to its proper width and depth. The disintegration of the banks at various sections has further diminished its discharging capacity, and

accounts to a large extent for the accumulation of silt at Moone weir. The tributary channels, where weed-growth and silt accumulation also exist, show signs of neglect and consequent deterioration, and require immediate attention.

Regarding the position at Crookstown weir we have to refer to our letter of the 18th January, 1935 (copy enclosed) and to state that the situation which then existed still prevails, to the detriment of the lands upstream.

It is obvious that, if the drainage works are not maintained in a reasonable degree of efficiency it will be only a matter of time until the benefits that accrued to the land, as a result of carrying out the drainage scheme, will disappear, while the occupiers of assessed land will still continue to be liable for the payment of the charges imposed on them under the Final Award. From the Annual Reports furnished to this Office, we are aware that the County Council have from time to time expended various sums on the upkeep of the Drainage Works in the District. However, from our Engineer's report it would appear that the amounts so far provided have not been sufficient to keep the Works in good repair and efficient working order. Accordingly, we have to request that your Council will be good enough to take early steps to rectify the banks where they have disintegrated and to remove the accumulations of weeds and silt where they exist.

We beg to state that the County Surveyor is under a misapprehension in stating that we did not deal with the objections raised by the proprietors of Crookstown Mill regarding the loss of water through the diversion of the Navigation River into the main river. We had the objections examined by our Investigating Officer and an Engineer, and we are assured that the works executed by us provided amply for the supply of water to the mill, but it is of course essential that the mill stream should be maintained at its proper depth and that any accumulation of silt which may have occurred should be removed. We understand that the Miller has placed boards on the weir above Crookstown Bridge to counteract the effect of the silting, but this constitutes an interference with the District, and once the necessary maintenance has been carried out on the mill-race he should be compelled to remove this obstruction. We may also direct attention to the necessity for keeping the syphon free from silt.

With regard thereto the County Surveyor wrote letter dated 15/7/38, as follows:—

Reference your letter of the 7th instant, enclosing letter dated 6th from the Office of Public Works (which I now return you herewith), the following is a copy of a report received from my Assistant to-day:—

The following is the Annual Minimum expenditure which would be necessary in order to maintain the drainage in reasonable condition: Main River Greese, 2,024 perches at 1/-, £101 4s. 0d.; 2 Mill Races, 468 perches at 9d., £17 11s. 0d.; 8 Tributaries, 1,267 perches at 4d., £21 2s. 4d.; 10 per cent. on above for Office and Legal expenses, £13 19s. 9d. Total, £153 17s. 1d.

This would be the normal yearly maintenance charge, but an additional sum of £50 would be required in the current year to deal with extra accumulated silt and damage to tanks resulting from former years. The Map has been re-deposited with the Co. Solicitor.

As the Rate of £60 was already made for the current year, the Council authorised the expenditure of an additional £50 for maintenance which would be raised in next year's rate.

Mr. Phelan proposed and Mr. Frayne seconded, and it was unanimously resolved: "That we call on Mr. Osborne to take steps to collect arrears of Rates on the Greese Drainage. We take a very serious view of the refusal of these Ratepayers to contribute to the work and maintenance of this drainage area, thereby throwing the whole burden on the County-at-Large, who have already contributed £710 in payment to the Board of Works for the original work."
